# SPECIAL TEXTILE PACKAGE IS YET TO TAKE OFF IN CREATING JOBS, PRODUCTIVITY

The special textile package approval by the cabinet and announced by the government in June which involves a total outlay of Rs 6,000 crore aimed at improving competitiveness and generating higher number of jobs through a string of labour reforms is yet to take off in terms of significantly creating jobs and improving production.

The apparel manufacturing, specific sub-sector within textiles targeted by the package, show that any significant rise in hiring is yet to happen under the new norms.

The package paved the way for fixed term employment in apparel manufacturing looking at its seasonal nature. While manufacturers have welcomed the move saying it allows them to deal with excess demand and idle labour issues at different times of the year, workers have argued it affects their livelihood.

The textile commissioner office is currently consulting with all stakeholders to iron out the difficulties in implementing the new norms. These include issues over wages, allowances and other statutory dues paid to workers. Also, the Textile ministry has fixed overtime hours for workers, not exceeding eight hours a week, in line with International Labour Organization norms. Manufacturers claim all this needs time to be incorporated in their operations, according to sources.

# 50 PER CENT STATE SUBSIDY FOR SETTING UP 'MINI TEXTILE PARKS'

The District administration showcased to a group of entrepreneurs engaged in handlooms and textiles business, the subsidy available for creating infrastructure facilities if they came forward to set up 'Mini Textile Parks' (MTP) in the district.

Addressing a group of about 20 entrepreneurs here on Thursday, Collector S. Natarajan said the State government has offered to bear 50 per cent of the total cost for creating infrastructure facilities such as laying of roads, sewage treatment plant, captive power plant and telecommunication, if they came forward to establish the parks.

After Chief Minister J. Jayalalithaa made an announcement to this effect in the State Assembly in September last year, the governmentpassed a GO on December 30, 2015 to bear 50 per cent of the total infrastructure cost or Rs. 2.50 crore, whichever was low, he said.

They should buy the land on their own and establish minimum 10 worksheds in the park to avail the subsidy for the infrastructure, he said.

The Collector said establishment of MTPs would help to improve the standard of living of handloom and powerloom weavers in the district.

There were more than 12,000 handloom and powerloom weavers in the district and they mostly lived in Paramakudi and Emaneswaram areas.

The Minister of Trade, Industry and Investment, Hajiya A'isha Abubakar, said this, yesterday, in Benin at the 28th Annual National Education Conference of the National Union of Textile, Garment and Tailoring Workers of Nigeria (NUTGTWN) and the Nigerian Textile, Garment and Tailoring Employers Association (NTGTEA). She said that the government, worried by the state of textile industry in the country, would revive the sector by ensuring that made in Nigeria textile was patronised by Nigerians. Earlier, the President of the NUTGTWN, John Adaji, urged the federal government officials to wear clothing from fabrics made in Nigeria to encourage local textile manufacturers.

### MORE YROUBLE FORWELSPUN INDIA: TWO CLASS ACTION LAWSUITS FILED AGAINST TEXTILE MAKER IN US

In more trouble for textile manufacturer Welspun India and its US subsidiaries, two class action lawsuits have been filed against the company here alleging it perpetrated "widespread fraud" for years by using inferior and less expensive cottons in its bedsheets and towels and marketing them as premium Egyptian cotton.

The lawsuit has been filed in the US District Court in the Southern District of New York by Meghan Abbott, a North Carolina resident who purchased bed linens by Welspun from retail store Target.

A second lawsuit has been filed in a St Louis federal court. Both lawsuits are claiming minimum damages of USD 5 million each.

The lawsuit alleges "widespread fraud perpetrated by one of the world's largest textile makers" Welspun India and its US subsidiaries.
